Simple present tense - (to) be: My name is Salma. I am Polish. We are students.		
Simple present tense - common regular verbs: I play football. She goes to college. We eat chicken. I don't drink wine		
Have got: I've got one sister. She's got two children. I've got a sore throat. He's got a headache.		
Present continuous of common regular verbs: I'm watching TV. She's studying English. We're not waiting for Ali.		
There is/are + noun (+ prepositional phrase): There is a television (on the wall.) There isn't a chair. There are some books (on the table.) There aren't any curtains.

<p>Simple present tense with frequency adverbs and phrases:</p> <p>I listen to music every day. She always goes to church on Sunday. He sometimes gets up late at the weekend. They never eat meat. Saara drinks coffee every morning</p>		
<p>Simple past tense of regular and common irregular verbs with time markers such as ago:</p> <p>I went to the doctors yesterday. She didn't visit Finland last year. Mubarak didn't come to college on Monday. They moved to the UK three years ago.</p> <p>Questions: When did they go? How did she travel? Did they fly from London?</p>		

SAMPLE

<p>Future time/arrangements using present continuous +use of time markers:</p> <p>I'm travelling to Australia next year. She's playing cricket at the weekend. Are you going shopping on Saturday? What are you doing tonight? Is Ruth coming to the party next month/in December?</p>		
<p>Word order in compound sentences: Use of and + but + or:</p> <p>She doesn't like swimming, but she loves tennis. I drink coffee but I don't like tea. I visited Manchester and I saw the stadium. They missed the train and didn't eat any lunch. I'm travelling by car or by train.</p>		
<p>Likes & dislikes with a limited range of 'verb + ing' & gerunds:</p> <p>I don't like playing football. I really like learning English. Jack enjoys listening to music. She loves camping. He hates smoking. We don't mind flying. They like dancing.</p>		
<p>Common verbs + infinitive:</p> <p>We decided to leave early. Anita wanted to go home. I forgot to tell the teacher. She didn't like to travel by bus.</p>

<p>Past continuous & (past cont. v. past.simple + when/and/so)</p> <p>What were you doing yesterday afternoon? I was studying. We were watching a film. He was working on his computer at 6pm.</p> <p>I was listening to the radio, so I didn't hear the doorbell ring. I was walking home last night and I saw my friend. She was cooking dinner when she cut her finger.</p>		
<p>Present perfect:</p> <p>I have visited London three times. She's eaten all the chocolate. I've lost my wallet!</p> <p>Have you been to America. No, I haven't. Has John gone out? Yes, he has.</p>

<p>Present perfect continuous:</p> <p>I've been gardening. What've you been doing? He's been reading a book all day. You look tired! Yes, I've been playing badminton. Have you been working all morning? Has it been raining?</p>		
<p>Past perfect(+ after/before):</p> <p>The had left the restaurant when John arrived. They left before I'd spoken to them. We'd finished all the work before the end of the day. I hadn't been to Lancaster until I started working there.</p>		
<p>Present and past simple passive:</p> <p>The flowers are watered by the gardener. The coffee beans are ground by a machine. The food was made by a brilliant chef. I was given this book by Jack.</p>

<p>Use of a wider & more combined range of simple, continuous, perfect and perfect continuous verb forms, active and passive: as outlined in L1 & L2 grammar summary</p>		
<p>Future in the past & future perfect/continuous:</p> <p>I was going to tell them, but I didn't get the chance. She will have finished this novel by morning. Next year you will have been working here for five years.</p>		
<p>Would expressing habit in the past:</p> <p>Every Saturday I would go on a long bike ride. My dad would read me amazing stories every night at bedtime. We'd visit Auntie Clara every summer.</p>
